

What do you do when a story you thought you knew isn't what it seems? What do you do when someone you thought of as an old friend is actually a stranger?

The story of the Good Samaritan is one of the best-known parables in Christian scripture. It's one that many of us can recite by heart. The story itself is poetic and archetypal: it follows the rule of threes with the Priest,

Levite, and Samaritan; the story wraps up with a happy ending; and there are clear heroes, villains, and bystanders for us to learn from. The moral, it seems, is obvious: it's a clear reflection of the "love thy neighbor" principle that Jesus abides by and teaches us to follow.

But there's more to it than that. So much more.

Joining us for Between Two Pews this week is Rabbi Abie Ingber-- scholar, educator, NPR commentator, and accomplished lecturer and raconteur. Rabbi sits down with Stephen and Sarah and peels back the layers of the Parable of the Good Samaritan, revealing historical context, bad blood, and a new way of interpreting the text. **Guide Our Steps: 75th Anniversary Campaign
Construction Update:**

Pardon our dust! Shovels in the ground, large machinery taking over, and signs of construction everywhere... Soon, this will be the reality for our church.

On July 5th, Graybach, LLC, a Cincinnati commercial general contractor and construction management company, will begin work on the building and the worship space to finally address our needs for accessibility and to greatly enhance our music ministry. They will use the far south parking lot (closest to Camargo Club Drive) as a staging area so we ask that everyone use the north parking lot (closest to the Indian Hill Elementary School) when parking at the church.



The area outside the hallway to the Nursery School and the lectern side of the sanctuary will be fenced off as a construction zone for the foreseeable future. This will allow them to excavate and prepare the building for the elevator addition.

Finally, we ask for your patience as this exciting project begins; we expect it to take the better part of the fall and into early winter so please be aware of ongoing work. We know this project will be a small inconvenience for some of us in the months ahead, however, we believe that we will all be pleased once we are finished with Phase One of the project.

The project is beginning with funding from the Board of Stewards in order to keep construction costs down and to sign contracts in our ever-changing economic climate.
