Join us for Sunday worship! Rev. Dr. Stephen Caine will be preaching for us. This week's gospel details the wonder of the Transfiguration: "*Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And*

he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him."



The transfiguration is one of the miracles of Jesus described in the Gospels, but what sets it apart from other miracles is that it's one of the only ones to happen to Jesus himself. Theologians consider there to be five major milestones in Jesus's life that are marked during the gospels: his baptism at the Jordan River, his transfiguration, his crucifixion, his resurrection, and his ascension.

We'll have a visitor on Sunday, as well! [Rev. Canon Michael Spencer](#) will be with us on Sunday. On March 5th, when both of our clergy will be out of town, Rev. Spencer will graciously be stepping in to lead worship at both the 8:00 Presbyterian Morning Worship and the 10:00 Episcopal Holy Eucharist! We look forward to having him with us this Sunday. Lenten Lunch Series: *To Be Made Well* Wednesdays from March 1 – April 5 12:00 – 1:00 PM in Library

Join us for a Lenten lunch series where we will enjoy a simple lunch and fellowship as we read and discuss Amy Julia Becker's book *To Be Made Well*.

From hurting bodies and souls to hurting relationships and communities, it's clear that things are not as they should be. Some of us live with varying degrees of physical pain, and others of us harbor the emotional pain of loneliness, shame, and guilt. Looking at our culture more broadly, we see the harm of our social divisions and the unyielding reality and impact of injustice and inequity. The

gospels brim with stories of Jesus healing people, but what does that mean for us today? Becker's *To Be Made Well* is a powerful invitation to personal, spiritual, and social healing as we reconnect to our bodies and souls, to God, and to our communities. For anyone struggling with pain or loss, for anyone concerned about the things that divide us, this book goes beyond wellness and beyond miraculous physical transformations to explore how we can—personally and collectively—be made well.

The cost is \$20 for the book (we will gratefully accept donations towards covering the food) and is open to all, so invite your friends! We look forward to having you join us. **You can get books and RSVP to the lunches at the church's office!**
