Episcopal Holy Eucharist

Join us this Sunday for worship! Starting this Sunday, we'll only have 10:00 AM worship for the duration of the summer. Forums will begin again in July. This Sunday is Episcopal Holy Eucharist with Rev. Simon Barnes preaching.



And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners." In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus performs two miracles--healing the woman with internal bleeding and bringing the synagogue leader's daughter back to life-- but something that is noteworthy is that Matthew gives much attention towards the fact that Jesus was sitting with socially "undesirable" people. Why would this warrant almost as much text as the miracles? One could argue that there were *three* miracles during this scripture reading.

Can you remember a time, perhaps when you were young, when you were sitting alone at lunch and keenly aware of the other empty chairs at the table? Or maybe you were new to a school or a job and facing the discomfort of not knowing anyone around you whom you could trust? You might even recall a time when you were deliberately ousted for something, be it an innocent mistake or the consequences of a bad decision.

When someone stepped up to rescue you from that loneliness and discomfort and anxiety, and the relief washed over you because someone saw you for you and decided to show that they cared-- that act of kindness when it was least anticipated is its own kind of miracle.

*Holy, generous God,
You invite us to hold the needs of our sisters and brothers
as dear to us as our own needs.
Help us love our neighbors as you love them.
In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.*
